Letter to Parishioners

Reading: Philippians 4 verses 11-12



Dear friends,

Happy New Year! If you turn to the back page of this magazine you will see the readings for services of public worship for the month ahead. The reading for 7th January 2024 includes the two verses above. As I write this letter (on the

11th December 2023) I have not written the sermon for the first Sunday of the New Year, though I have thought long and hard about what we should begin the year with. The word phrase "contented in Christ" keeps resonating in my heart, soul and mind.

We live in a world filled with discontent. All the advertisements on television, social media and billboards feed that discontent in society. No sooner is Christmas over than the New Year Sales begin and then we move in to the whole campaign for Valentine's Day and so it continues. Discontent is never satisfied, it is always hungry for more.

The real issue is not so much those trying to sell us things nor even the state of the society in which we live. The real issue is the state of our hearts and minds.

When I read the verse above I really wonder how Paul could not only be content but say he could be content in every situation? What did he know that I, we, do not know? My only conclusion is that Paul's identity, being and life was founded on and grounded on Christ Jesus. Paul faced beatings, shipwrecks and opposition everywhere he went and yet he was able to say he was content with life. Why? How?

When I read Paul's letters to the early church I have come to realise that for Paul his heart and mind was bowed to the will of God in his life. No matter what he faced he surrendered and submitted to the will of God. Only by knowing God is in control could he write Romans 8.28-29. Here is one key element for contentment in our lives - knowing, believing and trusting that God is in control of every situation.

Paul, was a normal man like you and I. He knew what it was to have plenty and he knew what it was to be in need. He had walked in poverty as well as abundance. Yet through it all his contentment was not in material things but in Christ and his living relationship with Christ. As we begin 2024 I believe this is the call of God to us as individuals and as a congregation - to be content in Christ. To set aside all ambition except belonging to Christ. To submit and surrender to His will for our lives. To offer ourselves totally to His service in Holy Trinity, in this community and, if He calls, further afield.


The challenge is, as the hymn says, to find in Christ our all in all, more precious than silver, more costly than gold, more beautiful than diamonds, and that not nothing you have compares to Him.

So in 2024 - seek to follow Paul's example and be content in Christ. Learn to trust God and to surrender to God in every situation of life in 2024. Learn to be content in the knowledge of the salvation of Christ. Work at it, pray for it and strive to be content and to learn to be content in all things.

Aluka Secondary School

in Zombo district in North Eastern Uganda

The select vestry donated £10,000 to this new build in Uganda. The 2017 team had raised over £50,000 for their trip and the £10,000 has been sitting in the church accounts ever since as it was not required during the two week visit.

The girls' dormitory at Aluka Secondary School in Zombo district in North Eastern Uganda. We are so thankful to all within the Holy Trinity Carrick family for their support towards this much needed project. Thank you personally to you Drew for being such a wonderful and faithful advocate for Fields of Life and the precious children and young people we serve.

The existing dormitory structure at the school can accommodate 40 girls but the conditions are cramped and unhygienic. The new dormitory will provide a safe, clean and dignified space for over 80 girls! This is only possible thanks to your amazing generosity and partnership – thank you!



Monica Amos from Fields of Life East Africa shared the incredible impact this dormitory will have on the young girls at the school.

"The new dormitory will ensure that the girls currently staying in the

boarding section have enough space and their standard of living will greatly improve. They will no longer have to live in such a congested way and be vulnerable to illness such as urinary tract infections. This will impact their performance in their studies as they no longer miss class due to illness. The new dormitory will also be equipped with electricity and therefore the girls will be able to study in the evening which will help them perform even better academically."



We are very excited that the contractors have completed 55% of the work and are on track to have the dormitory finished before Christmas – how amazing is that!!

To date, the dormitory is at ring beam level and soon, the contractors will complete the roof. The next step after that will be

commencing work internally and constructing the washrooms and toilet blocks for the girls.



Monica shared: "The girls and indeed the whole school community, are very excited to see the progress of the dormitory and cannot wait for the completion of it. For these young girls to have a spacious,

healthy and safe home while at school will give them hope for the future. They are so happy seeing the progress of this life changing project." Monica also captured some quotes from the wider school community and you can see excitement is building already for this new building!



"Thank you for making this dormitory a reality for our girls. The construction of this dormitory will encourage and attract more girls from neighbouring communities to come to Aluka Secondary School especially now that the dormitory will be even bigger. This project will help promote the rights of the girl child and help each girl attend school, stay in school and complete their education." Charles Kumakech Deputy Headteacher

"The construction of this new dormitory will be very good for us because we will now be comfortable and safe in our new boarding section. This will also help us with our studies as we can now revise in the evenings. Thank you for not forgetting about us." Treasure, a student at Aluka Secondary School


