Letter to Parishioners

Reading: Ruth 2 verses 3-4



Dear Friends,

As you may know by now I will be entering hospital on the 15th June to have my left hip replaced. I know I am too young to have such surgery but the consultant surgeon assures me I

am not and that it needs replaced. Too many years playing football for Portadown FC and Glenavon FC I fear have taken their toll. I would appreciate your prayers for the surgery itself and for quick and full recovery. Also, pray for Taylor and Janet as I am assured on past history I do not make a good patient. The pile of books for reading is slowly growing.

During the past few weeks in my morning bible readings I have been reading again the book of Ruth, with the help of a study guide by Alistair Begg (one of my heroes). The verses above he has given the title: The Tapestry of God's Providence. I loved his opening line:

What often appears to us to be a mess of knots is just the back view of the tapestry God is weaving.

How often do you, do I, look at life and genuinely come to the conclusion this is one unholy mess? I know I often fail to understand what has happened, what is happening and why it is happening. The older I grow the more life sometimes seems to be both unjust and without sense. I am sure we could all recall occasions when life made no sense. Maybe the suffering or the death of a loved one or something we just witnessed on the television news.

Whilst reading Ruth I realised that for Ruth and Naomi life really was a mess of knots. Naomi had lost a husband and two sons. Ruth had lost her

husband and had left her homeland to travel with her mother-in-law to a strange land. Yet the story of Ruth and Boaz is quite an amazing story. Arriving widowed and penniless in Israel they both had reason to despair at the frayed threads of their lives. They both faced a perilous situation with no "family males" to protect them or provide for them and yet, if you know the story, God in His providence was about to do an amazing thing. He was already weaving the threads of Boaz' life and the life of Ruth together. They would meet when Ruth was gleaning corn in his field. Gleaning was laid down in the Law of God but it was not always followed by landowners. However, in the providence of God Boaz did follow the Law of God.

In the providence of God Ruth happened to glean in the field of Boaz, who was a distant relative of Naomi. In the providence of God Boaz happened to turn up to the field the day Ruth was gleaning. In the providence of God the closer male relative who could redeem Ruth from this situation did not wish to do so. In the providence of God Boaz marries Ruth. If you look at the genealogy of Jesus Christ in Matthew chapter 1 you will see that Boaz and Ruth were the father of Jesse, who was the father of king David and if you follow the lineage you come to Jesus Christ. In the providence of God the frayed threads woven by god lead to the saviour of the world being born in Bethlehem, the village that Boaz was from.

What appears to be a mess of untied, untidy, frayed knots turns out to be the weaving of God's plan of redeeming, not just Ruth from a desperate situation, but the whole world from sin and death.

So, in my own life, I look at this moment of going in to hospital, something I would rather not do, as God weaving His providence in my life for His glory and my good. Let me encourage you today: No matter the situation that you find yourself in God is still in control and He is weaving His threads in your life to form you more like Christ than you were yesterday and for His glory. I think with that in mind I can face each

day with hope and confidence despite the frayed threads when I look at life from my perspective.




Young At Heart

A Farther Shore retells the well-known story of Peter the Apostle, a fisherman by family trade who becomes a disciple of the Jewish preacher Jesus of Nazareth. It follows the journey of the man who harvests the Sea of Galilee, showing great faith and much weaker faith as he becomes a "fisher of men". After Jesus' death, Peter becomes a leader of the early Christian Church. That much is familiar.

Glenn McGivern takes on playwright David Campton's hour-long monologue in which Peter reflects on his life. You can almost smell the salt and the fish guts from the set that is strewn with nets, pots, ropes and bright plastic buoys. Peter may have lived two thousand years ago, but the modern-day setting (and Ulster Scots accent) suggests a more universal and contemporary truth in Campton's writing. Lesser-known details are woven into the story, keeping even the most Biblically literate audience members on their toes.

McGivern demonstrates both a mastery of the weighty script and his adept understanding of the characterisation. Trevor Gills' direction elevates the patterns that run through Peter's thinking. Campton relishes the foreshadowing and parallels between the prophet Jonah (also the name given to Peter's father in this play) and Jesus, as well as highlighting the parallels of seagoing and levels of adherence to heavenly commands between Jonah and Peter.


