Letter to Parishioners

Reading: John 12 verses 1-10



Dear Friends,

At the beginning of this letter I am going to issue a warning: Some who read this will be offended by its content. However, we all need to prayerfully address what is being written here and, if necessary, repent and change our

attitudes and actions.

I want in this letter to address and issue that has troubled me for many years. It is not a new issue, in fact it is as old as the earth: The Priority of Worship.

A number of years ago, pre-covid, the Church of England decided that regular church attendance would be counted as one Sunday in four. At the time they were derided for such a decision but all they were doing was acknowledging the reality on the ground. To be honest this is a pattern that I now see at Holy Trinity. On any given Sunday I can count between 40 and 60 people missing from corporate worship. It would appear, even for those who claim to be followers of Christ, public worship on a Sunday is no longer a priority.

Livestream is not a substitute for in person worship with the people of God. I realise that some people, for genuine medical reasons, find livestream a means of worship and participation that otherwise would be denied to them. That is acceptable. However, what is not acceptable is the laissez faire attitude to being present with the people of God each Sunday. Scripture does not give us an option - we are commanded to worship God. It is the reason we were created.

Turn to verse 3 of the reading above. I want to draw your attention to three things which are, I believe, taught here about worship.

Thoughtful Preparation - Mary's devotion was the result of thoughtful preparation. It was not a spur of the moment or sudden rush of enthusiasm. Mary came prepared to worship the Lord Jesus. No one carried a pound of expensive perfume around in a bag in those days. In those days such expensive perfume was reserved for a wedding dowry or the anointing of a body at the time of death. For Mary to give it to Jesus she had to retrieve it from its place of safekeeping and to carry it to the dinner party. Thoughtful preparation in action.

Likewise, worship is not something that happens on the spur of the moment but requires premeditation, preparation and personal presence. If we rely on our feelings motivating us to go to worship then it is not a priority for our lives, even if we are born again.

Personal Consecration - Mary's act of devotion was an expression of personal consecration. Mary's ambitions and aspirations were wrapped up in this pound of perfume. Her social acceptability was implicated in what she did with it. She laid herself open to severe criticism from those around her. Yet she did it freely, even eagerly, because she recognised when her brother walked from the tomb, if never before, that Jesus was the Messiah, the Christ.

When Jesus said, verse 7: "She may keep it for the day of my burial" He was suggesting that Mary had recognised the purpose of His coming. Mary had recognised that here was the One who would die for the sins of the world and bring salvation to her and others. In light of this she offers all that she has, her greatest treasure, not to mention herself in worship.

If our worship is to be genuine then we, like Mary, must offer ourselves in consecration at the feet of Jesus. Christ is worthy of all we have. Nothing less than the consecration of our hearts and lives to Him is worthy of Him. He is not Lord of our lives if we cannot, or will not, be present on a Sunday morning to worship Him with His people.

Transformation - we read that the house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume Mary offered (verse 3). It would have permeated the whole house and everyone present. When those present left that house the aroma of the perfume went with them. No doubt people asked Where have you been? What is that smell? In 2 Corinthians 2:14-16 Paul uses a similar metaphor to describe the knowledge of Christ.

Being in God's presence in worship leaves God's fragrance on us. This can only come about when we are physically present in public corporate worship. Read Romans 12:1-2 - where Paul writes about the transformation that comes through offering ourselves as living sacrifices to God and through the renewing of our minds. Is worshipping God transforming you? That can only be answered if you are actually worshipping God with His people on a Sunday.

It has not been my intention to hurt, offend or depress anyone with this letter. In one sense it matters not the numbers who come on a Sunday morning. The audience is One - the living Lord Jesus. However, please carefully pray about what I have written. Pray for those who once worshipped with us but have drifted. Pray and then make contact with them and encourage them to come back. Lastly, pray for your own heart and life to be prepared, consecrated and transformed as we worship together the living risen Lord Jesus each week.
