Letter to Parishioners

Reading: Judges 6:12-13



Dear Friends,

I am sure we have all had the experience of meeting someone who asks: “Why has this happened to me/us?” Only last week I sat with someone who asked “What have I done wrong that members of my family have died?” We may have even asked such questions ourselves.

If you have, take a moment and read the two verses above. You will see that Gideon asked a similar questions of the angel of Lord who had appeared before him. I find it just slightly ironic that the angel calls Gideon “mighty man of valour” when at that precise moment he is hiding in a well threshing wheat so that the Midianites, who have invaded Israel, do not take the grain from him. Hardly the picture or a mighty man of valour.

Gideon asks the questions voiced for millennia: If God is for us then why has He allowed this to happen to us? If God is for us, then why does He allow trouble, suffering and pain in to our lives? If we are honest we are with Gideon in asking such questions.

Our lives are so full of ifs, buts, and why’s. The encouragement that I receive and take from Judges 6 is that if God can, and did, answer Gideon, then He can answer my seemingly difficult questions and queries. Even if those answers are not what I expect, thought they ought to be or even wanted to hear.

In Judges 6:7 when the people of Israel cry out to God for deliverance in their suffering under the Midianites, God responds not by sending a delivering army of angels but a prophet to teach them (verse 8). Not the answer they were expecting and maybe not the answer they wanted either.

God knew that in the midst of all their trials and tribulations they needed to hear and understand His Word. Ultimately they needed to turn back to Him and trust in His promises. The prophet told them what the angel would tell Gideon: “The Lord is with you!” The presence of God and the existence of trials, trouble and suffering can, and do, coexist. That is often forgotten in the midst of all that we experience in this life. We somehow think that suffering and God cannot coexist. Read Genesis 50:20 or any of the Gospel accounts of the Crucifixion to see how wrong such thinking is.

Now read verse 14. There was no conversation between God and Gideon over the plight of the nation of Israel. God did not seek to explain the reasons behind the invasion by Midian. Instead God tells Gideon to go and save Israel.

Verse 15 - I think is the response of all of us. Gideon protests that his clan is the smallest and weakest in Israel and that he himself is the least in his father's house. How can I save anyone? This was the first step to his victory over the Midianites. He admitted his inadequacy and his dependence on God. This is where God begins the work in all of us.

Only when we know our shortcomings and admit we are helpless, powerless and unable to save ourselves, no mind anyone else, and that we need God's help - then the work of the Lord begins in us.

God in His Word promises that our weakness plus His strength is sufficient for any task He calls us to (Philippians 4:13).

So, today as you face the trials and the troubles of this weary life trust in God's promise to never leave you nor forsake you. Trust in His promise that in Him you can do all things. Trust His Word, even when the circumstances of life challenge it.

Personally I take encouragement from Gideon (and numerous Psalms) that it is okay for me to ask God Why questions in my prayers and to seek His face for answers. When I voice such in prayers there is such a relief and then I turn to God's Word and remind myself of His promises and I rest secure in those.

DO NOT INCLUDE

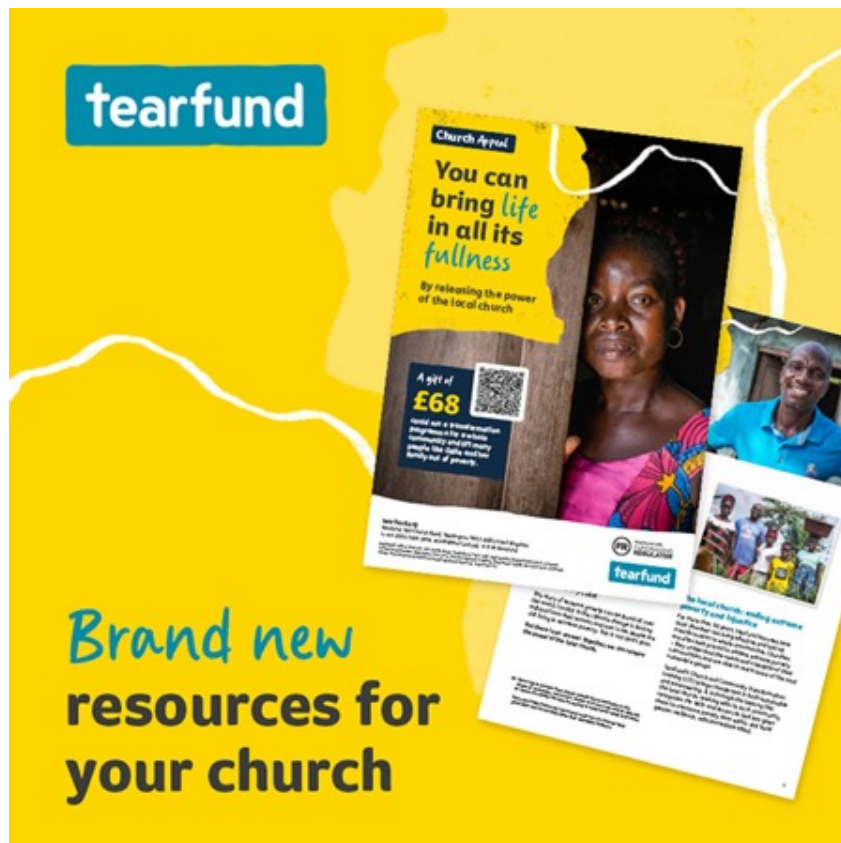
