#### Letter to Parishioners

Reading: Ephesians 4 verse 31



Dear parishioners,

I am sure you have heard people refer to some illnesses as "the silent killer." I wonder have you ever thought about "the silent killers" in your life and in the fellowship of the church.

Allow me to suggest three: bitterness, resentment and self-pity. These are three silent killers that appear at some time or another in all our lives and in the life of a church fellowship.

Sometimes life is not all we had hoped for or planned for. You waken in the morning and have that sense of dread and foreboding in your heart and soul. The temptation is to become bitter and resentful about something or someone. The other temptation is to fall into the pit of self-pity and all the debilitating emotions and thoughts that accompany it. The temptation is to become disillusioned with life and to begin to stop coming to worship, to stop reading our bible and no longer to pray. The result is resentment and bitterness grow in our hearts and souls and self-pity flourishes even more. What are we to do?

One helpful place to start is to ask God for His protective hands to be around us, to hedge us in on all sides. We need to ask God to protect us from the powerful emotions and spiritual trouble that those three silent killers bring into our lives. Turning to God is always a good place to start. Paul then offers us some advice in the words of the verse above. Take a moment now and read it again, read it out loud as the bible was written to be read out loud and not just silently into ourselves.

Paul encourages us, in fact commands us, to put away all bitterness, wrath and anger. It was obviously there in the church at Ephesus, just as it is in our lives and therefore in the life of Holy Trinity. Whilst Paul's command is easier said than done it still has to be carried out. We have a part to

play in riding such bitterness, resentment and self-pity from our lives and the life of the fellowship to which we belong.

If you have time now, turn to 1 Samuel 1 and read the story of Hannah. Hannah had all the reasons in the world to allow these three "silent killers" to take root and grow in her heart. Month after month, year after year and she was still not expecting a much longed for baby. What does she do? She pours her heart out to God in prayer and knowing she was heard she walked away in peace and at peace.

As Hannah left the Temple her circumstances had not changed, she still was not pregnant but what had changed was her spirit. Her heavenly Father had heard her prayer and freed her soul and mind from those "silent killers." If you know Hannah's story you know that God did indeed grant her prayer and the mighty man of God, Samuel, was born.

When we turn to God, like Hannah, and pray then God does protect us from these "silent killers." Yet, we have a responsibility also to put them away from our heart, from our minds and from our fellowship. We are to give them no room but weed them out and place them before God in prayer. The best place for the situations and circumstances we do not understand, or cannot control, is in the hands of Almighty God. That is where they belong and then we can be at peace. So be encouraged today and do not let those "silent killers" steal away your peace or your joy in Christ




