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Letter to Parishioners

Reading: Galatians 6 versos 9-10 and 17-18



Dear Friends,

I am sure you have heard those all-too-familiar cries of exasperation and, maybe even, desperation. It might well be that a few of them have crossed your mind this morning

somewhere between the alarm going off and you getting out of bed:

Going from bad to worse.

Out of the trying pan and in to the fire.

Between a rock and a hard place.

"Cheer up, things could get worse." So, I cheered up and sure enough, things got worse!

My mother told me there would be days like these, but she never said they would run in packs.

Tough days! We all have them, some more so than others. Some days are really tough and we wonder how on earth we are going to get through. Then there are days when the sun shines and all is well with our world. The truth is life is a mixture of both for many people. Life does not seem to get any easier as we grow older and there is often a looking back with nostalgia at days past when the sun always seemed to shine in the summer, we had snow at Christmas and life was better. Rose tinted hindsight! So what is the answer? How can we handle tough days when the enemy works overtime to persuade us that God does not love us or care about us? Just recently, I have found

encouragement from the verse above. To me there are four gold threads sown in to the fabric of Galatians 6:

Verse 9 - Don't lose heart. On tough days, you gotta have heart. Whatever you do, do not quit. Persevere. Stand firm. Be strong, resilient, determined to see it through. Ask the Lord God to build a protective shield around your heart and remind yourself, often, that He keeps His promises to you.

Verse 10 - Let us do good. On tough days the very opposite is true of our hearts and minds. We often feel like doing evil. Fume, scream, fight, pout, mate even swear but we are certainly easily irritated. Rather than do this we should still our minds, our hearts and souls before God. Consciously turn it all over to God in prayer. Take time out. Sit down in our favourite chair and just pray - a simple, inelegant, short prayer. I often pray the following:

Lord God, you know my heart and my mind and my emotions this morning. You know how I am feeling and that today is an awful day. Please protect my mind, my heart and my soul. Give me rest in my mind, my heart and my body. Help me control my emotions, my thoughts and especially my words. I commit the day in to your hands and help me to rest secure in that. Amen.

Verse 17 - Let no one cause you trouble. This is wonderful advice but it is so difficult to do. Remind yourself on tough days that the thorn within your life belongs to the Lord Jesus Christ. So, stop leasing it out to negative thoughts and the enemy to rule.

Verse 18 - Let grace be with your spirit. Allow the full impact of grace to flow through your thoughts, your attitudes, your responses and especially your words. Open the gates of your mind and soul and let grace have free rein. Allow grace to soak in to your tough day and allow grace to rule over your tough day. I am not going to pretend it is going to get easy or the difficulties will disappear, they often will not but what

will change is your attitude, your demeanour and your approach to the tough day. Why? Because now the Lord Jesus Christ rules and guides and not the circumstances of your day.

Take a moment now and read again the four verses in Galatians 6. Take a moment and commit the day to Christ and allow His grace to flow in to your heart, mind and soul.

Fields of Life



An update on our water programme which Holy Trinity Carrick have generously supported in the past. We would greatly value your prayers for this important work and for our drilling team. Our team are currently based in

Northeast Uganda in Pakwach district. Pakwach is an incredibly difficult area to drill in, with very challenging geological conditions. However, the need is enormous, with a shocking 82% of people still living with no access to clean water.

Earlier this year, in April, I had the privilege of visiting our drilling team when in Uganda. I have had the joy of visiting and spending time with our drillers over many visits over the years and each time, I have been both shocked that people are forced to walk miles every day just to collect dirty water, yet also inspired at the hope being brought to these communities by our drillers and donors through the gift of providing them with clean water. During my trip, I got the opportunity to travel to a community in the Pakwach district where our drillers were working. As with all Fields of Life projects, we travelled to the hard-to-reach places. To reach the community, we drove up a mountain, through areas that didn't even have dirt tracks. It was incredibly isolated, and we passed by murky streams where people were collecting contaminated water because they had no other choice. Eventually, we arrived at an area that looked completely barren and that is where we found our drilling team.

As I looked around, I could see homes lining the periphery. It became clear that this borehole was going to provide clean water for hundreds of families. In fact, one of drillers, Kizito, commented that single borehole would not be sufficient to meet the needs of the surrounding community and that more would need to be added. During our visit, we heard stories of families that had lost children and family members who had fallen while climbing the rocky mountain in search of water. It is truly

mind-blowing how our drilling team continue to place themselves in the hardest and harshest of places, where the need is so extensive. We would greatly value your prayers for our team as they travel from village to village, away from their families, working long hours to bring the precious gift of clean water to vulnerable communities. Thank you as always for your faithful partnership,

Our next meeting will be on Monday 7th October at 11.00 and we are looking forward to hearing our speaker Heather tell us about her life and work in India.



Stand By Me



Ethiopia Kindergarten Education Project



Dear Holy Trinity Church,

I am delighted to be able to write and share an update on our Early Years Education Project which you so generously supported. As you know, three years ago Stand by Me began thinking about how we

could transform our Early Years Education in our two schools in Ethiopia.

We know that around the world one of the greatest gifts we can give our kids is the opportunity of a life changing education. Each year in our schools in Ethiopia we have 80 children who join us in Kindergarten. They are from the poorest families in their communities, many of them have heart breaking stories, and without a place in one of our schools, and the support of sponsorship, most would not have the opportunity to go to school at all.

As part of the Early Years Education Project, a small team of teachers from Northern Ireland, alongside our Ethiopian staff, put together a proposal to transform our Kindergarten classroom environments, which included the provision of new classroom furniture and resources to support a play-based approach to learning.

Last year we celebrated the momentous occasion of the arrival of our shipping container filled with the resources that would allow us to transform our four Kindergarten classrooms in both of our schools. At Easter we had the enormous privilege of sending our team of teachers from Northern Ireland to Ethiopia to take this wonderful project to the next stage.



Seeing the vision become a reality

During the first few days there was much anticipation from our staff and children in Ethiopia about all that would be unpacked from the container that now sits proudly on site in our Bethany School. Students from the older grades helped us to unpack and inventory every item, and incredibly, not one thing was missing for each of our 4 classrooms. The team of teachers from Northern Ireland then delivered 5 days of training, helping our 9 staff members from Bethany School and Abdi Academy to explore how to best use these wonderful resources, and sharing best practice together.

Training together

This training included each of the Kindergarten teachers and their assistants, and also the headmasters of our two schools. Together they explored the value of play based learning and focused on how the new

resources would support children's learning in numeracy, literacy, imaginative role play, construction and outdoor play.



Our Ethiopian staff had already been doing an incredible job of creating a positive learning environment for our smallest children by creating and developing their own handmade resources, crafting items from paper, card, and recycled materials and displaying children's work around the classrooms. This served to create a wonderful foundation on which we were able to build.

As the teachers shared together through training it was apparent that there was so much to be learned together, many similarities in teaching style and practice, and a great excitement at the new resources that would further enhance what our Ethiopian Kindergarten teachers were already doing. With their support we were privileged to help them clear and set up their new learning environments, filled with new tables, chairs and classroom storage, a book corner, a play den, and many

wonderful learning resources to help develop and foster the creativity and imagination of our youngest learners.

On seeing the classrooms for the first time, one of our staff members shared that, "there is nothing like this anywhere in Ethiopia". We are absolutely delighted that because of your generous support there is now, and it will provide our youngest Stand by Me kids the best start to their education not just this year, for many years to come.

Exploring their new classrooms

At the end of the week we welcomed some of our Stand by Me kids into their new classrooms. Aster, one of the Kindergarten staff, shared "we could read the happiness on their faces".



Already, just a few weeks in, our Kindergarten staff and headmasters have observed the benefits for our children. The chairs and tables are a

much more suitable size and more conducive to group learning. The opportunity to write on individual blackboards and whiteboards has improved children's pencil skills and writing, while using pegboards and completing jigsaws



have helped to develop fine motor skills. Teachers also have more time for planning lessons because they do not have to spend so much time preparing or creating resources. Our staff have observed that there is even greater enthusiasm among the children to learn, to explore and share the wonderful new resources in their classrooms.

In reflecting on our time together with the wider team Batire, one of our Kindergarten staff in Abdi Academy, shared that through the training "we acquired a lot of knowledge and skills, it motivated us and contributed to our development...we are becoming different teachers".

Getu, the headmaster at our Bethany School captured the gratitude expressed by all of our staff and on behalf of the children; "I don't have the words to say thank you...all this is helping our kids to go one step ahead in their education". Thank you for your wonderful support towards this significant project, helping our children in Ethiopia to have the best possible start to their education, and providing a foundation from which we hope they will continue to flourish and reach their potential.


