Letter to Parishioners

Reading: 1 Corinthiens 12:7



Dear Friends,

Let me begin by saying thank you to you all for your prayers and good wishes over these last few months as I have recovered from hip replacement surgery. As I write this letter it is

week five after the operation and it is going well, at least I think it is going well. As you can imagine sitting around doing very little is a test of character for me and the patience shown by Janet and Taylor has to be admired.

Thank you especially to Jack and all the different people who stepped in to preach over these few months. I have really missed being with you all on a Sunday morning. Hence the verse above.

If you disappeared from Holy Trinity who would notice? If you were absent for an extended period of time, what would Holy Trinity miss?

Paul in this chapter in Corinthians tells us that God has given every believer, every please note, at least one gift for the good of His body, the church, Holy Trinity. Therefore we should be missed when we are absent, because God has gifted you in a particular and specific way at this precise moment in time to uniquely useful in Holy Trinity.

The tragedy is that so many Christians sit on the sidelines in church and believe they have nothing to contribute or are content to sit back and allow others to minister to them. The teaching of the Bible is very clear throughout - God ministers through us. Yes, every single one of us, not just Jack and I at the front or the music team or those who lead prayers and read the Scriptures to us, or who teaching LIGHT each Sunday. We should always be ready to receive ministry from others as they exercise their God-given gifts for the building up of the body of Christ at Holy Trinity. Yet, our default position should be to give, not only or primarily to receive. Even the youngest in faith or age has something to give.

When you and I exercise our God-given gifts in Holy Trinity we manifest the Holy Spirit in the presence of God's people. Gifts such as hospitality, kindness, prayer, a helping hand, an arm around the shoulder, tears and many others we don't consider "spiritual" are key to a living, thriving, growing church. To such gifts people respond. Words of comfort, sympathy, concern and encouragement have an impact long after they are spoken and often sustain us in the darkest of moments.

You have something to contribute that is unique and that is essential for the life for Holy Trinity. So, assured that to each is given a gift, by God's Spirit, for the good of us all, be encouraged to pour yourself out rather than holding yourself back this term in Holy Trinity. Holy Trinity needs what you, through God's Spirit, have to offer. As the children's chorus says

"There's a work for Jesus none but you can do."

Question: What is God asking of you this term in Holy Trinity?

down and when the gap between income and expenditure increases the treasurer must make comment.

I am delighted that so many have opted to donate to the parish by standing order but now is the time to prayerfully consider your donation in time for the new year. The number of increases to the amount originally donated by individuals since the set up of the standing order is very low. In other words, once it's set up it very rarely changes. I am sure those contributing by envelope, if they think about it would agree the amount donated does not change.

In November as I prepare for the 2024 budget, I would be delighted to know that as a congregation we are thinking and praying about what we give back to God via our offering.
