Letter to Parishioners

Reading: Psalm 46.10



To those in Christ Jesus at Holy Trinity Woodburn,

I am writing this letter on the 2nd July 2024 for the September 2024 magazine (DV). It seems strange to be writing such a letter almost two months before it will be read. Just

last night I emailed the sermon series readings for September till December to all who need them to choose readers, select the worship songs and hymns and for the poster which goes up in the foyer. We all plan ahead at times. Usually for holidays, meal planners, school timetables and social events. No doubt somewhere in all of this work gets scheduled in as well. Let me ask you one question: Do you plan your time with God? It is so easy for time with God in His word, prayer and fellowship with other believers to be squeezed out by our busy lives. God often gets the left overs and we end up with a deep sense of guilt.

Take a moment now and sit in a quiet place. Open your Bible at the verse above. Read it slowly and read it a second time. Now read it a third time, slowly. Did you take in what it says? Look at the latter part of the verse: "and know that I am God." Now look at the opening part of the verse: "Be still..." Did you catch that? We are commanded by God to be still in order that we might know that He is God. It is not an option or maybe a suggestion but a command. We are commanded to "be still" and the outcome of "being still" will be that we will know that He is God. God wants us to know Him, why else would He send His Son? He wants us to know Him personally and not just as some distant figment of imagination or religious teaching. No, He wants us to still our hearts, to come aside from the busy noisy world we inhabit and to know that He is God. Why? The answer is found in His Word - because He loves us and created us to be in a relationship with Him.

John 3.16, probably the most well known verse in the Bible tells us four things. I am not going to tell you those four things but here are four questions to help you figure them out:

How does God feel about me? What has God done for me? What does God want from me? What will be His response to this?

If you cannot get the answers then come and ask me. I will gladly share the answers with you. Why would I not give you the answers in this letter? Surely, I am failing as a pastor to teach you if I do not give you the answers. Actually, the opposite is true. I am failing you as a pastor if I give you the answers. You see, in order to find the answers to those four questions you have to stop what you are doing. You have to open your Bible at John 3.16, read it, think about the questions and formulate the answers. What you have down is to "be still and know God."

You have obeyed the command of Psalm 46.10. It wasn't that difficult and I pray it has blessed you as you did so. Now you know how easy it is to obey this command the challenge is to obey it each day. Take time each day to be still and know God. There are lots of wonderful daily bible notes to help you do just that. Look online at thegoodbook.co.uk they have really good bible based daily readings for all ages and abilities. I personally use Explore. An alternative is Truth for Life Daily Devotions (365 bible readings), it is about £15 on Amazon and that is for a year's readings. There are two volumes and I can recommend both. There are other devotional books out there but my only advice is make sure it is Biblical, that is based on the text of Scripture, and not just the writers thoughts.

So, the challenge for us all as we begins a new terms work is that we be still and know that He is God. Let us not allow the work of Holy Trinity

take us away from being still and knowing God. Our primary relationship is with God. He has provided a way for us to know Him in and through the life, death, resurrection and ascension of his only son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. In John 3.16 He has told us how we can know Him and in Psalm 46.10 He has commanded us to be still and to know He is God. What else do we need to do but to obey?

Money Coach, Gina Adams who will be leading the new course, says, 'With the soaring cost of living over the last few years, we've seen how important it is that people know how to successfully manage their money, whatever their income. It's vital that we know how to balance what we have, save for emergencies and stay out of debt.

Our money coaching course is here to equip people in Carrickfergus to do that. We'll look at things like building and balancing a household budget, prioritising spending and keeping our finances stable into the future

'Money coaching isn't just about getting to grips with money practically – it's about helping people find the freedom that comes with being in control of their finances. It can impact mental health, physical health, relationships, work life and self-belief.

'Plus, there's an amazing sense of achievement when you reach a goal, like finally being able to buy something you've been saving up for. Managing money well can be so rewarding!'

Gina adds, 'The course is completely free and will run over four weeks at Carrickfergus Vineyard Church. There's something for everyone to learn – from those who have never used a budget before to those who simply want to re-evaluate their financial situation. All are welcome!'

Fields of Life

Thanks to your support, Fields of Life have been training communities on how to set up village savings groups. These microfinance groups allow members to access small loans which help them to break the cycle of poverty, provide for their families and expand their businesses.

Seven communities in Kole District, Northern Uganda, recently completed this training and are now reaping the benefits.



Esther, a mother of three boys and three girls, shared with us how she is now able to support her children's education.

"I get money seasonally from harvesting and selling the crops I have grown, but sometimes a school term begins when I do not have any money to pay for my children's school fees.

Before the savings group started, it was challenging to meet the needs of my children at the start of each new school term. However, once I joined the group, I started saving and I have now saved for six months in advance. I was able to take a loan last term to pay the school fees that were due for my six children. Because of this, they were not sent away from school.

I am happy and my plan is to continue saving. I am even hoping to buy chickens, which will help sustain our family."



Deborah from Obubu also shared how she used a loan from her savings group to start another business to supplement her income from farming.

"I used to rely only on farming, which is seasonal. Sometimes crops would yield less due to bad weather. I did not have an income source that would help support me on a day-to-day basis.

After saving for some time in my savings group, I took a loan, and I was able to start a business selling snacks. I run it in the afternoon and evening after working in my garden.

This has really helped with supporting our family. We can buy soap and medicine, among covering other needs. I encourage my fellow women to join the saving groups so that they too will be able to begin their businesses and thrive."



Gloria, aged 44 years and a mother of eight children, shared with us how the savings group has boosted her business.

"I have been saving regularly in our savings group. I took a loan and added stock to my shop, which was lacking products that the community wanted. As a result, now that I am stocking more, I have more customers and my profit has increased. I am using part of the money to pay the school fees for my children."

Through your continued support, these three women - and many more women like them - now have the opportunity to earn an income and have the **hope of providing a brighter future for their families.**

Please, also, don't think it's just for ladies, we have many guys visit us, plus we have men in our team


